LISTENING FOR TRUTH

Chasing the Light Liturgy (Responsive):

As people born of the divine spark, (...) the divine spark that cannot go out, that no darkness can overcome.

The journey through Lent is a path through light and darkness.

Today we continue our journey, but the light has all but gone out.

What remains is meant to remind us of love, the love that God has for us, and for each other.

We allow ourselves to believe that love is as fragile as this flame: easily snuffed, quickly lost.

God's love for us is eternal and unconditional. Christ's love for us is bold and brave. But our love, for God, for Christ, for one another often has restrictions and limits that we set, and that love wilts before it has a chance to grow.

(put out candle)

For those times when we limit the love that we are called to share,

for those times when we have called ourselves unworthy of your unconditional love, for the hate that we allow to grow in our hearts where love should flourish,

for the grudges that stand as barriers between us and full and loving relationships with you and with one another,

for the ways that we diminish the light of creation

because we are too afraid, too selfish, too angry, we pray O God. Guide us by your light, even when all light seems to go out.

Reading: Matthew 21:1-17

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, 'Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.' The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.' Then Jesus entered the temple and drove out all who were selling and buying in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money-changers and the seats of those who sold doves. He said to them, 'It is written, "My house shall be called a house of prayer"; but you are making it a den of robbers.'

The blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he cured them. But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the amazing things that he did, and heard the children crying out in the temple, 'Hosanna to the Son of David', they became angry and said to him, 'Do you hear what these are saying?' Jesus said to them, 'Yes; have you never read, "Out of the mouths of infants and nursing babies you have prepared praise for yourself"?' He left them, went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there.

This is the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.
