Theme Conversation

Ash Liturgy (Responsive):

Throughout this season of Lent, we are all being asked to carry the ashes of last year's Palm Sunday branches. When we waved those branches we were declaring our faith, our trust, and our dedication to Christ.

These ashes are a symbol of promises: promises made, promises kept, and promises broken. Let us come before Christ honestly and humbly.

We raised our palm branches in celebration of you,

and on those same leaves have written our sin and brokenness, despite your having broken into our lives to show us a new way.

We carry the ashes of those palm branches as a reminder.

These ashes remind us of all that we put ahead of you: power, wealth, things. We put our trust in all of these things because we feel some level of control over them. Often our pursuit of them is more important than our service to you and to your world.

We carry these ashes to remind us of our focus on - even worship of - worldly things.

Sharpen our focus on you, O God, for we long to worship you with our whole selves.

For a moment, let us focus on these ashes, lifting our prayers for guidance and promises to follow to Christ.

Gentle Jesus, mighty Spirit, come inflame our hearts anew, we may all your joy inherit if we bear the cross for you, if we bear the cross for you.

Reading: John 19:1-16a

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying, 'Hail, King of the Jews!' and striking him on the face. Pilate went out again and said to them, 'Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no case against him.' So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, 'Here is the man!' When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted, 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' Pilate said to them, 'Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him.' The Jews answered him, 'We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God.'

Now when Pilate heard this, he was more afraid than ever. He entered his headquarters again and asked Jesus, 'Where are you from?' But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, 'Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?' Jesus answered him, 'You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore, the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin.' From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out, 'If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor. Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor.'

When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, 'Here is your King!' They cried out, 'Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!' Pilate asked them, 'Shall I crucify your King?' The chief priests answered, 'We have no king but the emperor.' Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.

This is the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.
