LISTENING FOR TRUTH

Reading: Luke 2:1-15

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!' When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.'

RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

Invitation to The Table:

We come to the table late, but just in time for the feast that awaits, and we come to celebrate the greatest gift we could receive, Emmanuel, God with us. Christ calls us to the table to share in the Holy Sacrament of Communion. We gather at the table just as Christ and his disciples did. And so, all you who are hungry, before you is the feast of the most high. All those who thirst, here is the cup of blessing, waiting to quench the thirst of the world.

For communion this night, you will be invited to come forward, to seek the table even as we seek the stable. Please take the bread and the juice back to your seat, and at the appropriate time we can take in the grace of the elements together.

Know that you are welcome here, regardless of the road that brought you to this place. Because though this table sits within these four walls, it is not the table of Quispamsis United Church, nor even is this the table of the United Church of Canada. This is the table of our brother and saviour Jesus Christ, who welcomes all of a variety of age, race, gender, or sexuality. You who hunger for the Good News, may eat. You who thirst for justice, may drink.

Remembering the Meal (Responsive)

And on a night, much like this one, a star tells of a birth, but also of a life that will be: Of a night in which Jesus was betrayed,

where he took bread, and gave thanks;

broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

"Take eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." And after supper he took the cup, gave thanks,

and gave it for all to drink, saying:

"This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As we reflect on the life that was and the hope of life yet to be, we shout with praise the mystery that is our faith:

Christ has died;

Christ is risen;

Christ will come again.
