VU 264 (vs 1, 2, 4)

Today's Scripture: Luke 9:28-36, 43b-45

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and, in those days, told no one any of the things they had seen.

While everyone was amazed at all that he was doing, he said to his disciples, 'Let these words sink into your ears: The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into human hands.' But they did not understand this saying; its meaning was concealed from them, so that they could not perceive it. And they were afraid to ask him about this saying.

This is the Gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Praise be to you, O Christ.

Invitation to the Table

Know that you are welcome here. Because regardless of where the table around which we gather sits, it is not our table, nor is it the table of Quispamsis United Church, neither is it the table of the Funday St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region, nor even is this the table of the United Church of Canada. This is the table of our brother and saviour Jesus Christ, who welcomes all regardless of age, race, gender, or sexuality. You who hunger for the Good News, may eat. You who thirst for justice, may drink.

Gathering (Responsive):

The Lord be with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Prayer of Thanksgiving (Responsive):

God of all times and all places, God of the infinite and infinitesimal, in the blazing splendor of your glory you called forth:

When he supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:
