The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!'

-Isaiah 6:4-5

Greetings Kindred in Christ,

Before reflecting on this week's text, I want to invite you into a moment of prayer for our kindred in the Halifax area as they continue to fight wildfires that have displaced thousands.

Shepherding God, be with our kindred in the Halifax area guide to shelter those who have been evacuated from their homes, keep safe those who are working to manage the flames, encourage those in safe locations to embrace those displaced. Work through each of us as we continue to see some of the disastrous results of climate change close to home. AMEN

The excerpt of scripture that opens these announcements comes from early on in the book of the prophet Isaiah, and it is a familiar tune sung by those called by God to do a thing or spread a message. Rarely do any of those called by God jump up and say, "Here I am," (Mary, mother of Jesus being a notable exception). But it isn't just prophets and priests who are shy when God calls. Regular people like you and I will probably start singing that same song of, "are you sure you have the right person, God?"

It's not that we are particularly down on ourselves, at least for the most part, but when we think of someone that God calls to do something, we almost immediately jump to Christ, and how can we follow that? The truth is that God **overwhelmingly** calls the broken, the lost, and the wayward to be messengers of grace and bearers of love. I think that most of us would fit into one or two of those categories, and I **know** that God is still calling.

God is still calling because there is so much pain in this world in need of healing. God is still calling because we are a people of strife longing for peace. God is still calling because shouts of hate are striving to drown out messages of love. God is still calling, and God is calling you, and me. God is calling each of us and all of us. So even if we don't feel like God has the right number when we are called, let's answer, and let's do our part in the building up of God's kingdom.

Let us pray:

Here we are, O God, choose us. Though we are weak, in you we find strength. When we are broken and falling apart, you make us whole. When we are lost and far off, you come seeking and find us. You embrace us, and welcome us home. Here we are, O God. Choose us, and we will follow you. AMEN
