An affirming ministry strives to be fully inclusive of people of all sexual orientations, gender identities and other marginalized groups. As we work toward becoming "Affirming", this is what it could look like for QUC:

- Ongoing education and story sharing sessions
- Showcasing books in our Library that support diversity and inclusion
- Placement of rainbow symbol visible outside of church and inside the sanctuary
- Teaching of affirming music and incorporating affirming messages and language in our services
- Ongoing review of our policies and practices to reflect our intentions
- Ongoing communication with the community, schools, youth and/or community centers
- Visibility of being affirming on our website, print materials, advertisements, signs, etc.
- Commitment to ongoing support for outreach/social justice and promoting reconciliation and healing and action for change
- Affirming Committee to become a standard committee promoting awareness

We will worship, pray, support, serve, seek, celebrate, learn, work, play and grow, just like we always have. What you may notice, however, are the public, intentional and explicit statements of welcome, inclusion, and justice-seeking for all people who have been marginalized and whose sexual orientation and gender identities have been historically excluded within the church and in society.

No longer can we sit back and be satisfied with the "status quo". We need to live into a vision of justice and inclusion for <u>all</u> God's people while respecting each other's diversity of opinion.
